I, CHESTER L. FREEMAN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, October Twenty-seventh, Nineteen Hundred and Fifty-nine, as

NAVY DAY

and call upon all citizens of the State of Minnesota to display the national flag and take part in appropriate observance of this day through the many channels open to them.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this twenty-seventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine and of the State the one hundred second.
