

A Proclamation for "YOUTH APPRECIATION WEEK"

- WHEREAS, over 97% of our youth have constantly exhibited qualities of good citizenship in word and deed, and have contributed their services to the betterment of our schools, communities and country; and
- WHEREAS, unacceptable conduct on the part of a relatively few youth has accentuated and dramatized delinquency in the minds of the great majority of our citizens; and
- WHEREAS, law abiding citizens of all ages are distressed by the stigma cast by juvenile delinquents over the entire teen-age group; and
- WHEREAS, proper recognition of our youth will demonstrate to them that our communities appreciate their good citizenship and their outstanding services; and
- WHEREAS, the Olympic Clubs throughout the world have selected the week of November 9th through November 15, 1959, to be set aside specifically to honor the youth in our communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 9 - November 15, 1959, as

YOUTH APPRECIATION WEEK

and urge every citizen of this ^{state} community to join in this opportunity to show our appreciation to our youth and to emphasize their contributions as good citizens.
