A Proclamation for "GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER DAY"

WHEREAS, George Washington Carver was one of America's great scientists; and

WHEREAS, George Washington Carver's achievements give evidence of our belief in the realization of the American tradition of brotherhood among men of all races and creeds; and

WHEREAS, January 5th is the anniversary of George Washington Carver's death in 1943;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 5, 1960

in Minnesota and urge all citizens of the state toward greater realization of the contributions of all races and creeds to life in our country.
