Dear Sir:-

Section 2, chapter 518, G.L. 1913, provides "that the commissioner of labor upon the removal from office of any officer or employe appointed after examination by the board of examiners, shall file a statement in writing, giving the reasons for said removal, with the secretary of state, which statement shall be open to public inspection. The failure of the commissioner to make and file such statement within five days after such removal shall operate to reinstate such official or employee".
