"PROCLAIMED DAY"

WHEREAS, Brotherhood Week, sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews, gives freedom-loving people an opportunity to rededicate themselves to individuals to the basic ideals of respect for people and human rights, which are essential to our way of life; and,

WHEREAS, the Fathers of our country defined the purpose of its founding to be "to form a more perfect union," and in the words of George Washington to "give to bigotry no sanction, to persecution no assistance; and


WHEREAS, our way of life, passed to us as a heritage which we must safeguard for future generations, is threatened by forces which would destroy our liberties;

LET THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do call upon our citizens to join with other Americans in the observance of the week of Washington's birthday, February 22-29, 1960 as


