WHEREAS, the National Merit Scholarship Corporation, an independent non-profit organization established in 1955, conducts the annual program and the Merit Scholarships are sponsored by over ninety business and industrial organizations, foundations, professional groups, and individuals and over \$15 million in scholarships has been awarded; and,



In observance and recognition of the day.


