

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 3

To the Honorable Ernest F. Hollings, Governor of the State of South Carolina

- WHEREAS, it has been represented to the Governor of Minnesota by John S. Connolly, Attorney at Law representing one Rocco S. Lupino, that Nathan Corn presently confined in the State Penitentiary in Columbia, South Carolina, is an essential witness for the defense in the kidnapping case of the State of Minnesota v. Rocco S. Lupino; and
- WHEREAS, the Attorney General of the State of Minnesota has been advised by the Attorney General of the State of South Carolina that it is necessary for the Governor of Minnesota to request of the Governor of South Carolina by means of an Executive Order to take appropriate action to enable Mathan Corn to testify in Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS, John S. Connolly, Attorney for the defense has requested the Governor of Minnesota to initiate action to permit Nathan Corn to appear as a witness in the case of the State of Minnesota v. Rocco S. Lupino and has further agreed that all expenses relative to the transportation of Nathan Corn from the State Penitentiary in Columbia, South Carolina, to St. Paul, Minnesota, and return shall be borne by the defense; and
- WHEREAS, sufficient funds to defray these expenses have been forwarded to the authorities in Columbia, South Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman. Governor of the State of Minnesota, hereby respectfully request the Governor of the State of South Carolina to issue an Executive Order permitting appropriate authorities of the State of South Carolina to transport Nathan Corn to St. Paul, Minnesota, to testify in the above referred matter Monday, April 4, 1960, and return him to the State Penitentiary in Columbia, South Carolina, upon the conclusion of his testimony.
