

A PROCLAMATION FOR "ACCIDENT AND HEALTH PROTECTION WEEK"

WHEREAS, in spite of the average careful citizens' efforts, the number who die and the many who are injured through accidents and sickness each year has steadily increased; and,

WHEREAS, there are hazards in the home and on the highways that lie beyond the conscious control of the individual, even beyond his human intent and awareness of moral responsibility; and,

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we set aside a period of time to focus public attention on the necessity of protection against accident and sickness, emphasizing the importance of a reverence for life, one's own as well as the lives of others;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 24 through April 30, 1950 as

"ACCIDENT AND HEALTH PROTECTION WEEK"


in Minnesota in recognition of the insurance industry and its vital contributions to the protection of human life, health and property.


