WHEREAS, for the past half-century, Mother's Day has been observed by the American people on the second Sunday in May in tribute to the person each of us holds dear; and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States, by resolution of May 8, 1914, has designated the second Sunday in May each year as Mother's Day; and

WHEREAS, Mother's Day is a time in which we remember and honor our mothers, both living and dead;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, May 8, 1960 as


"MOTHER'S DAY"

and urge that appropriate observances be held throughout the State, and further request that reverence be paid to the memory of Miss Anna Jarvis, the founder of Mother's Day.


