

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, multiple sclerosis strikes more frequently in northerly climates, such as Minnesota's than in more temperate states; and

WHEREAS, the crippling effects of multiple sclerosis on adults between 20 and 40 years of age is a situation of increasing concern to citizens of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, public support of the program of the Minneapolis, St. Paul and Duluth chapters of the National Multiple Sclerosis society is essential to the welfare of those who are crippled or made helpless by multiple sclerosis;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 1 through May 7, 1960 as

"MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS DAYS"

and urge all Minnesotans to support the 1960 campaign of the Minneapolis, St. Paul and Duluth chapters.
