EXTRACT OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF VILLAGE COUNCIL OF VILLAGE OF FREEPORT, STEARNS COUNTY, MINNESOTA, June 30, 1959

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Freeport, Minnesota, was held at the Village Council rooms in said Village on the 30th, day of June, 1959, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.

The following members were present: Herbert J. Hennen, Edwin B. Hiltner, John Wensman, John Rose, and Gilbert Ritter

John Emapp, the village attorney, attended the meeting and reported that on June 5, 1959, the District Court of Stearns County entered its judgment ordering and directing the Village Council to detach the lands belonging to Edward Bonfig, as requested in his petition to the Village Council which was presented to the council on June 4, 1958.

After full discussion member John Wensman introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING ORDINANCE DETACHING LANDS
WHEREAS, prior to June 4, 1958, Edward Bonfig duly filed his petition
with the Village Clerk for the Village of Freeport, Stearns County,
Minnesota, praying for the detachment of certain lands owned by him
from the Village of Freeport, and

WHEREAS, said petition having been duly presented to the Village Council of said Village of Freeport, Minnesota on June 4, 1958, at a meeting held to consider said petition, and said Village Council of said Village of Freeport, Minnesota did on said 4th. day of June, 1958, duly adopt a resolution rejecting said petition of said Edward Bonfig for detachment of said lands, and

WHEREAS, the said Edward Bonfig duly appealed to the District Court of Stearns County, Minnesota from said resolution rejecting said petition for detachment, and the District Court within and for said Stearns County, did on June 5th. 1959, make and enter its judgment on said appeal ordering and directing said Village Council of said Village of Freeport, Minnesota to detach the lands described in the petition, which lands are entirely situated in the Township of Oak, Stearns County, Minnesota.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the direction of the judgment of said District Court for Stearns County, Minnesota, be it resolved that the Village Council of the Village of Freeport adopt the following ordinance:

## ORDINANCE NO. 49

AN ORDINANCE TO DETACH LANDS FROM THE VILLAGE OF PRESPORT

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Village Council of the Village of Freeport,

Stearns County, Minnesota, that the following described lands owned
by Edward Bonfig and described as follows, to-wit:

Lots One (1), Two (2), Three (3), Sight (5), and the fractional Easterly Six and 1/10th. acres of Lot Four (4), all in Auditor's Subdivision Number Five (5) of Section Two (3) in Township One Hundred Twenty-five (125) North, Range Thirty-two (32) West, Steerns County, Minnesota.

be and are hereby detached from the Village of Freeport, Stearns County, Minnesota, purpuant to the direction of the judgment of the District Court of Stearns County, provided, however, that said lands so detached shall be subject to taxation for the payment of principal and interest on all Village of Freeport bonded indebtedness outstanding at the time of the detachment to the same extent as if it were still a part of the Village of Freeport.



Dear Sir:

On July 15, 1959 I mailed you a certified copy of the ordinance of the Village of Freeport detaching certain farm lands from the Village. Your office thereupon returned the ordinance and stated that procedure for detachment of property should be pursuant to Chapter 686 Sec. 6 Laws of 1959. In compliance with your instructions I then sent the certified copy of the ordinance detaching the land to the Minnesota Municipal Commission on February 16, 1960. On February 26, 1960 Joseph Robbie, chairman of the Munic⊷ ipal Commission returned the resolution and stated that the Municipal Commission could not make an order detaching the lands from the Village of Freeport because the detachment occurrs on a petition filed prior to the effective date of the Laws of 1959, Chapter 686 and it is therefore not before the Municipal Commission and they have no jurisdiction. Now, either the Secretary of State or the Municipal Commission must have the authority to give effect to this ordinance detaching the lands from the Village of Freeport. I am inclined to agree with Mr. Robbie of the Municipal Commission that inasmuch as this detachment resulted from proceedings commenced many months before Chapter 686 of the Laws of 1959 were passed that the proper procedure is for the Secretary of State to make the Order Detaching under the old law and notify the County Auditor. In fact, Mr. Robbie of the Municipal Commission informed me that there is an attorney general's opinion to that effect. As a private attorney, I of course am not entitled to opinions from the attorney general but if there remains any doubt in your mind I wish you would ask the attorney general for an opinion. A certified copy of the resolution of the Village of Freeport contains all the necessary facts setting forth when the petition for detachment was filed with the council and when the district court for stearns county finally handed down its decision ordering the Village council to detach the land from the Village.
