

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the abrupt emergence of springtime in Minnesota traditionally brings forth a sudden surge of refreshment and renewed vigor; and

WHEREAS, men, women, and children everywhere in our state experience a revived enthusiasm for the natural beauty of our state; and

WHEREAS, at no other time of the year is it more important that we strive to rid our communities of the drab and the offensive, the unhealthy and the hazardous, so that we and our many vacationing guests may enjoy to the fullest the exceptional beauty for which our state is known;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 2 - 7, 1960 as

"CLEAN-UP WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

and urge all public and private agencies and citizens generally to help improve and maintain the health, safety, and appearance of our communities; to approach this job in a safe, systematic, and sensible manner; and to support all programs designed to eliminate these health and safety problems which still confront us.
