WHEREAS, Minnesotans are sometimes unaware of the outstanding job being done by our public employees throughout the state and do not fully appreciate its value; and


WHEREAS, public employees over the nation are devoting the first full week of June to furthering good will and understanding between public employees and the citizens whom they serve.


"PUBLIC EMPLOYEES WEEK"

and call upon all citizens of Minnesota to recognize the work being done each day by these dedicated public employees.


