

A PROCLAMATION
FOR
"MINNESOTA SAFETY SABBATH"

WHEREAS, All of the efforts of man to end the death and destruction on the streets and highways of Minnesota will not succeed until each driver realizes that impropriety and impatience on our highways are acts of immorality; and,

WHEREAS, Minnesota clergymen of all faiths have joined in an effort to make every motorist aware of his moral responsibilities when driving an automobile;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday and Sunday, June 4 and 5,

"MINNESOTA SAFETY SABBATH"

and urge every Minnesotan to join in this united religious campaign to awaken in the conscience and mind of every driver the realization that negligence at the wheel of an automobile is a transgression of God's Command, "Thou shalt not kill." I further urge every driver to keep this Commandment and to practice the Golden Rule by "doing unto others as you would have them do unto you", not only on SAFETY SABBATH, but throughout the year.
