WHEREAS, God's gift of sight is one of mankind's most precious treasures; and,

WHEREAS, each year more than 30,000 persons become blind; and,

WHEREAS, HALF OF ALL BLINDNESS IS NEEDLESS AND PREVENTABLE; and,

WHEREAS, it becomes our personal and community responsibility to do all possible to prevent needless loss of sight; and,

WHEREAS, we recognize the need for the experienced counsel and guidance, carefully and conscientiously provided through the program of the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness; and,

WHEREAS, adequate support of this program is deserving of our thoughtful consideration and action;

IT IS THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 1960 as


"SIGHT SAVING MONTH"
