


PROCLAMATION

CHILD SAFETY WEEK

- WHEREAS, Throughout our State of Minnesota more than 850,000 children will be returning to school this month; and
- WHEREAS, Our strength and hope for the future lies in our school children; and
- WHEREAS, To preserve the lives and health of these youngsters during their trips to and from school and playgrounds, we must endeavor to impress safe living on our children's minds; and
- WHEREAS, Safety education does not end with our children but must be impressed on the minds of the driving public to further promote an awareness of the need for special precautionary measures; and
- WHEREAS, There is nothing that supercedes the importance of preventing a motorist from risking the life or health of a child;


NOW, WHEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 6 - 10, 1960, as CHILD SAFETY WEEK in Minnesota, and I urge every citizen to extend wholehearted support toward the development of a safety conscious populace to insure our school children a long and useful life. I recommend that we: Be alert, and a definite driver! Obey all traffic warning signs, and show extra care when approaching the clearly recognized 'school zone' sign. Acknowledge each child as a human caution sign and drive as if each child was the driver's car.


