- WHEREAS, the art of barbering has long been an honored calling; and,
- WHEREAS, in encouraging the good grooming of his fellow, the barber makes an important contribution to individual and community morality; and,
- WHEREAS, the ancient mages of the barbering and medical arts is still reflected today in a conscientious interest by barbers in health and hygiene; and,
- WHEREAS, the barber has won a place in American folklore as the prototype of a friendly, communicative and informed person; and his shop has won a similar status as a symbol of good fellowship, harmony and wholesome fun; and,
- WHEREAS, barbers are, in fact, deeply interested in community affairs and active participants in them; and,
- WHEREAS, it is fitting that barbers be given appropriate recognition;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Charles L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 22 - 27, 1950, as

"NATIONAL BARBER WEEK"
