WHEREAS, the women who work in the business and professional field contribute substantially to the welfare of their community and state; and,


WHEREAS, it is proper that Minnesota honors its working women and the members of the Minnesota Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc.;

"NATIONAL BUSINESS WOMEN'S WEEK"




