PROCLAMATION

"FARM-CITY WEEK"

"URBAN-RURAL DAY"

WHEREAS, prosperity for the urban dweller is related directly to the prosperity of the farmer, for the farmer is the best customer for the goods produced in urban factories; and,

WHEREAS, the urban dweller, dependent on a vigorous and productive agriculture for an abundant supply of food, should be aware of a widening gulf of misunderstanding between the farmer and urban dweller; and,

WHEREAS, greater understanding by the farmer of urban problems and the urban dweller of farm problems will help eliminate misunderstanding; and,

WHEREAS, Farm-City Week provides an unparalleled opportunity for farm and city people to become re-acquainted;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of November 18 through November 21, 1960 to be

"FARM-CITY WEEK"

and in special observance of this week, declare November 21, 1960 to be

"URBAN-RURAL DAY"

and I urge all citizens of this community to participate to the limit of their capability in the joint visits, the seminars, the pageants, fairs, civic and social events attendant to a successful Farm-City Week in Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this twenty-first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty and of the State the one hundred third.
