

A PROCLAMATION FOR "YOUTH TEMPERANCE EDUCATION WEEK"

WHEREAS, today's youth will be tomorrow's leaders in business, government, science, literature, and the arts, and

WHEREAS, it is our mutual responsibility, as citizens of this great nation, to encourage our youth to be of strong moral character and to uphold the principles and ideals of honesty and integrity, and

WHEREAS, civic, educational, religious, and social organizations, through temperance education programs, have contributed much in preparing our youth to use sound judgment in establishing their own moral, spiritual, and social standards;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 16 through April 22, 1961, as

"YOUTH TEMPERANCE EDUCATION WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens of our state to join with me in recognizing the importance of temperance for all citizens, and to encourage the continuing progress of youth temperance education programs in our state and nation.
