WHEREAS, the struggle by Susan B. Anthony to secure women the right to cast their ballot and to share other responsibilities and obligations of citizenship has been regarded as a great contribution to American civil rights, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Minnesota has long recognized that the inestimable contribution of Susan B. Anthony should be honored and noted with special observance in the public schools and by all civic-minded citizens of our State, and

WHEREAS, February 15 marks the anniversary of the birth of this distinguished and gifted woman, who, with others, led the way for establishment of women's rights in public life and for a heightened appreciation of the contribution they bring to our State and Nation,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby call to the attention of all people that February 15, 1961 is




in Minnesota and should be marked by appropriate observances.
