

A MEMORANDUM FOR THE GOVERNOR

- 1. Minnesota highway traffic accidents are a cause of concern for all, and
- 2. considerable evidence has been accumulated that an underlying cause for many of these accidents is improper vision on the part of certain classes of vehicles as well as pedestrians, and
- 3. defective vision in all areas of activity can lead to harmful accidents with resulting death or injury to human life, and
- 4. the nature of corrective eye care given varies in developing eye care and other available means as well as in developing progress of visual training.

THE GOVERNOR, J. CLAYTON ANDERSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby prohibit the week of March 5 through March 11 as

and urge all our citizens to a greater awareness of their responsibility to themselves and others to the end that the words "I don't see" become obsolete as an excuse for accidents.

By the Governor, I have therefore set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty one and of our State the one hundred third.
