

A PROCLAMATION FOR LOYALTY DAY

WHEREAS, the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United States have designated every May 1 as Loyalty Day, with the designation approved by President Dwight Eisenhower on July 14, 1950, and

WHEREAS, it has been also important each day that our citizens be reminded of the bloodships which have been sacrificed by our country as well as the demands that are made on all of us to resist the Communist ideology and oppose it with the ideology of freedom and justice, and

WHEREAS, such positive action begins with a love of country and fidelity to the precepts—principles which are embodied in the word "Loyalty",

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 1 as

LOYALTY DAY

In the State of Minnesota and urge that all citizens join in public demonstration to evidence to other peoples of the world our undivided devotion to our government and way of life, including such public loyalty demonstrations as the Veterans of Foreign Wars and other public-spirited groups may see fit to sponsor.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one and of the State, the one hundred third.
