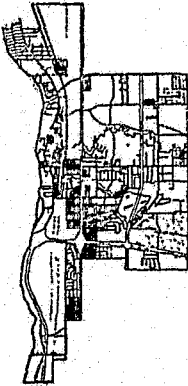

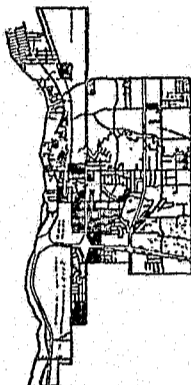

SPECIAL ELECTION
March 27, 1961

Declaration of Results Thereof

In accordance with Section 4.03 of the Charter of the City of Fridley, the City Council declares the results of the 1961 Special Election to be as follows:

A. The total number of ballots cast was 1327

B. The question voted upon was as follows:

"SHALL THE CITY CONTINUE TO OPERATE ITS MUNICIPAL LIQUOR STORE RATHER THAN ISSUE PRIVATE LICENSES?"

C. The vote and number of defective and not voted ballots is as follows:
