
WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon every man, woman and child in our state to revere and respect the emblem of the nation in which we live,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim June 14, 1961, as


"FLAG DAY"
