A PROCLAMATION FOR "IMPROVED MAIL SERVICE DAY"

WHEREAS, the mail service of the United States has given the people of our nation an inexpensive and efficient means for communication, and

WHEREAS, the mail service of the United States has been the subject of extensive study by other countries who seek to emulate the service extended to every citizen of the United States for the price of a 4 penny stamp, and

WHEREAS, the volume of mail and the increasingly heavy work load should lead all citizens to contemplate ways and means in which to cooperate with the mail service, and

WHEREAS, the mail service of the United States deserves the wholehearted support of all the people, as well as their cooperation with the Post Office Department in its work, and

WHEREAS, the Post Office Department recognizing the value of assistance from executives of business firms has called this meeting,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim July 19, 1961 as

"IMPROVED MAIL SERVICE DAY"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to join with the residents of all states in full cooperation with their respective postmasters.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty-one, and of the State the one hundred fourth.
