

A PROCLAMATION FOR "CHILD SAFETY WEEK"

- WHEREAS, the combined efforts of parents, teachers, police, school and public safety officials must be enlisted to educate children in safe travel habits, both in walking and riding bicycles, and
- WHEREAS, many small children will be facing a new experience-- walking the streets alone for the first time--making their way to and from school, and
- WHEREAS, motorists should be made aware of their responsibility to exercise extreme caution in School Zones, near playgrounds and wherever groups of children are active, and
- WHEREAS, parents should be alert to any relaxation of good traffic safety practices as a result of carefree summer living at camp or on home playgrounds,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby declare the week of September 6 - 13, 1961 as

"CHILD SAFETY WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all our citizens to cooperate in every way to make our streets and highways safe for everyone, young and old, and to remember their responsibilities as a motorist this week and throughout the year.
