

A PROCLAMATION FOR "PUBLIC WORKS WEEK"

WHEREAS, the health, prosperity and standard of living of the people of this state are significantly influenced by the adequacy of our public works, and

WHEREAS, state and local units of government are constantly striving to provide these facilities and services in the most efficient manner possible, and

WHEREAS, the success of such efforts is influenced by the people's attitude toward their public servants and their understanding of the importance and complexity of the work they are doing, and

WHEREAS, a nationwide program is being undertaken to stimulate greater awareness of the importance of public works in the lives of the American people,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 1 - 7, 1961 as

"PUBLIC WORKS WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to become better acquainted with the importance of public works in their daily lives and pay tribute to the men who build, operate and maintain the public work facilities and services provided to the people of this state.
