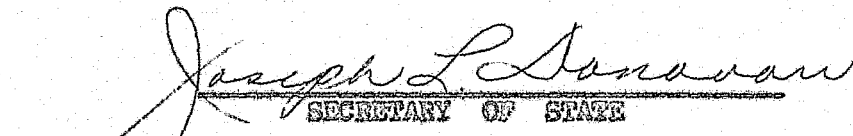
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby declare September 21, 1961 as
