Dear Sir:

You are hereby advised and notified that I have made an application for the survey of United States public land in sections 16, 17 and 8, township 57 north, range 19 west of the fourth Principal Meridian, Minnesota State, which land includes section 16 in the above township, and it appearing from the records that the title to said section 16 is still invested in the State of Minnesota, and I am now advised by letter E526406 dated Dec., 20, 1915 from the Hon. Commissioner, General Land Office, Washington, D.C. that said application has been investigated by a United States surveyor and his report has been acted upon and approved and instructions issued for a survey of the lands erroneously omitted from the original survey, am also notified to advise owners of adjacent lands such as you by giving you thirty days, exclusive of the day of the receipt by you of this notice, to file with the Hon. Commissioner, General Land Office, Washington, D.C. any evidence or papers tending to show cause if any there be why the lands should not be surveyed and disposed of as public land of the United States.
