
A PROCLAMATION FOR CREDIT UNION DAY


- WHEREAS, the credit union members throughout the world will celebrate International Credit Union Day on Thursday, October 19, 1961, and
- WHEREAS, credit unions provide an invaluable means whereby people may pool their savings, and assist themselves to fill their needs for credit at a low cost, and
- WHEREAS, credit unions have proved an effective and versatile tool for combating usury, unfair credit practices and encouraging thrift, and
- WHEREAS, these credit unions not only promote the economic security of their members, but also strengthen democracy, encourage individual responsibility and the practice of true brotherhood and thus benefit our entire community, and
- WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota now has 483 credit unions whose combined membership totals 255,639, representing a significant proportion of the citizens of Minnesota,
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby declare October 19, 1961 as

"CREDIT UNION DAY"

in Minnesota and urge our people to give fitting recognition at this time to the many benefits brought to them through credit unions as well as extend to the leaders and members of the Minnesota credit unions my greetings, congratulations and sincere wishes for continued success in serving their fellowmen.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this nineteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, and of the State the one hundred fourth.
