At this writing, the First Bank Charge Plan has been in operation one week; the initial purchases under the Charge Plan began on Wednesday. June 17. A spanking, brand new department has been organized to handle FBCP. The department at the present time has a permanent staff of eleven employees, most of them new members of the First Family. We thought if would be nice to introduce them to you, showing them at their work in the Charge Plan offices on the 27th Floor of the First National Bank Building. Shown above, are the first three employees to be assigned to the department—Charge Plan Manager, Frank H. Delaney, Jr., Cliff Tillander, and Judy Middlebrook.

Shown below, are several of the men, who have worked during the past several months soliciting merchant-nembers of this new service. Gathered around Frank's desk are Andy Sall, Elmer Dutya, John Raymond, Jim Moore, and Cliff Tillander, under whose direction the merchant solicitation program was carried out.

The map on Frank's desk contains pins showing each of the 470 merchant-member locations. More pins are being added each day, the merchant solicitation phase of the Charge Plan program, which started on March 27, found many First salesmen on the street. In addition to those shown below, merchant calls were made by Dick Long of the First State Bank of White Bear Lake;





MR. SCOTT HONORED

Meet the Honorary Consul of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg and the Secretary thereto, also known as Ulric Scott, Vice President and Trust Officer of First Trust Company, and his Secretary, Ruby Welter. Ruby holds the Grand Ducal Decree of Grand-Duchess Charlotte of Luxembourg, de claring Mr. Scott's appointment; and he is reading the exequatur, signed by President Eisenhower, which is the official recognition of a representative of a foreign country.

Thinking that you, too, would like to examine these documents, and knowing that Mr. Scott wouldn't want them to become dog-eared through handling, we've reproduced them on the following two pages. We happen to know that Mr. Scott carries the Grand-Duchess Charlotte's picture around with him in his pocket. Of course, it's on a piece of Luxembourg currency, but nevertheless 'tis her picture, and it's pretty well worn, too, from his admiring it.

Luxembourg has not had a consulate in this area for over twenty years. It is

fitting that Mr. Scott received the appointment to fill this vacancy, for he's a true Luxembourger since his maternal grandmother was born in the Grand-Duchy. Oddly enough, Ruby also is of Luxembourg descent. His territory will cover Minnesota, North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Idaho. There are large colonies of Luxembourg descendants in the St. Paul, St. Cloud, Winona, and New Trier areas, and in the quaint little village of Lux-

embourg in Stearns County.

Mr. Scott fells us that the 999-squaremile, picturesque European State of Luxembourg, bounded by France, Belgium, and Western Germany, is one of the loyliest creations of nature and man. It is a country of opposites. While a visitor might feel as though he had slipped into a different world-one of castles, turrets, and moats-he would soon discover that the progressive Duchy also is the home of modern farms and mighty steel mills. It is the seventh largest steel producing nation in the world, and Luxembourg City has been referred to as the steel capital of Eur-

The Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg came into being through power politics, and has been tossed about for centuries. It has survived because of the spirit and determination of its people. Its basic philosophy one sees carved in stone on a monument in the capitol city and everywhere in the hearts of the people: "WE WISH TO REMAIN WHAT WE ARE".

Our heartiest congratulations to Mr. Scott upon this unusual honor he has received and we're relieved to have him assure us that we won't have to bow to him or extend a formal greeting when we meet him around the bank, but that the usual "Hi" will still be in order, even though he is the Honorary Consul of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg.

My dear Mr. Secretary:

I have been advised by the Luxembourg Ambassador from Washington that correspondence from your office has been forwarded to the old address of the Consulate in Chicago and subsequently directed to the Consulate in Washington.

I have the honor to inform you that the Government of the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg has established a Consulate in Saint Paul, Minnesota. The jurisdiction of this Consulate includes the states of Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming and Idaho. I have been appointed Honorary Consul for this office.

The Grand-Ducal Decree of the Grand-Duchess Charlotte of Luxembourg covering this appointment who dated March 23rd, 1959. The Exequator signed by President Dwight B. Eisenhower, of the United States, was dated May 6th, 1959. For your records, I am enclosing a copy of the July "The Spokesman" issued by The First National Bank of Saint Paul which on pages 12 and 13 contains the copies of the Grand-Ducal Decree and the recognition of the appointment of a Local Consul by the President of the United States.

Would you kindly adjust your records to show that the Local Consulate is now in operation at the above address. Unless I hear from you to the contrary, I shall assume this notification is considered sufficient for your records.
