

ORDINANCE NO. 195, NEW SERIES

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING REAL PROPERTY  
TO THE CITY OF BLUE EARTH

BE IT ORDAINED By the City Council of the City of Blue  
Earth, as follows:

Section I.

It is recited that there has heretofore been filed with the City  
of Blue Earth, Faribault County, Minnesota, a municipal corporation, a petition  
signed by all of the owners requesting the annexation of that certain tract of land  
located in the County of Faribault and State of Minnesota, more fully described  
as follows, to-wit:

A tract bounded by a line commencing 80 Rods South of the Northwest  
Corner of the Northeast Quarter of Section Twenty (20) in Township  
One Hundred Two (102) North of Range Twenty-seven (27) West of the  
Fifth Principal Meridian, and running thence East 40 Rods, thence  
South 12 Rods, thence West 40 Rods, thence North 12 Rods to point of  
beginning.

Section II.

It is hereby determined that all of the owners of said tract of  
land have signed said petition; that said land is unplatted and does not exceed  
Two Hundred (200) acres; and that annexation thereof to the City of Blue Earth  
will be in the best interests of the municipality and the territory affected.

Section III.

It is hereby declared pursuant to the provisions of law applicable  
thereto; that said tract of land described in Paragraph I above be and the same  
hereby is annexed to the City of Blue Earth, a municipal corporation.

Section IV.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect after its passage and  
publication as required by law.





Figure 6 shows the results of the regression analysis. The dependent variable was the number of days off work due to musculoskeletal problems. The independent variables were age, sex, years since last injury, time since last surgery, and the three risk factors. The model explains 70% of the variance in the dependent variable. The results show that older workers are more likely to have musculoskeletal problems, while women are less likely. Years since last injury and time since last surgery are also significant predictors. The three risk factors (physical demands, psychosocial factors, and organizational factors) are all significant predictors of musculoskeletal problems.
