WHEREAS, the sincere and continued interest of LULAC has always been to foster better understanding and relations between the Latin American and the citizens of this State and LULAC, all during its thirty-three years of existence has devoted its efforts to furthering the aims and purposes of the organization through education and comprehensive programs of citizenship responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the theme "Thirty-three Years of Progress Through National Expansion" is being promoted during National Lulac Week, in commemoration of the important and significant role LULAC has played in the field of education and citizenship training in our State and Nation:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edmer L. Anderson, Governor, do hereby designate and proclaim the period between February 17th and the 24th, 1962, as
