A PROCLAMATION FOR "SAFETY ON SKIS WEEK"

- WHEREAS, some five million Americans enjoy the healthful and invigorating sport of skiing; and
- WHEREAS, through lack of knowledge and failure to observe good safety practices, many are needlessly injured; and
- WHEREAS, participation in healthful, vigorous sports such as skiing is of benefit to the general health of our nation's citizens and encourages physical fitness of young and old alike; and
- WHEREAS, the volunteer men and women of the National Ski Patrol System have formulated high safety standards for the benefit and protection of our nation's winter sports enthusiasts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of February 17-25, 1962 as

"SAFETY ON SKIS WEEK"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens and organizations interested in ski safety to support and participate in the effort to help reduce skiing accidents.
