WHEREAS, the future of Minnesota's electronics industry is of great concern to all the people of Minnesota, who want encouragement given to this vital segment of our state's economy,



"MINNESOTA ELECTRONICS RECOGNITION WEEK"


in recognition of the important role the electronics industry plays in Minnesota's economy.
