## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on April 23, 1932, the mental health volunteers in Minucsota will honor those individuals and organizations who have served this worthwhile program for a period of ten years; and

WHEREAS, through the generous devotion of time, talent and material goods, these volunteers have immeasurably benefitted and improved the services we are able to provide our mentally ill and mentally retarded; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota was the first state to set up a coordinated volunteer program so that this citizen interest could be channeled effectively into all aspects of our mental health programs, including community as well as institutional services; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that these dedicated and selfless individuals receive tribute for their outstanding contribution to the welfare of all Minnesotans.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 28, 1962, as

"MENTAL HEALTH VOLUNTEERS RECOGNITION DAY"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to recognize the work being done by Minnesota volunteers to improve and expand the services and personal attention so important in a well-rounded, meaningful mental health program.
