A PROCLAMATION FOR "GOLF DAT"

WHEREAS, during the last ten years \$850,000 has been realized from this observance for the United Service Organizations, the American Red Gross, the Caddie Scholarship Funds, the U. S. Blind Golfers' Association, the National Amputee Golf Association, the Jaycee War Memorial Fund, the United Voluntary Services, the American Women's Voluntary Services and the U.S. Olympic Association and other worthwhile projects; and

WHEREAS, this day in 1962 will offer all the golfers of America an opportunity to again assist many of these worthy charities and projects, as well as an opportunity to compete against the PGA Champion and the USGA Open Champion;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, June 2, 1962, as

"GOLF DAY"

in Minnesote and urge all Golfers of our state to cooperate in this worthy venture by playing a round of golf on National Golf Day, thereby contributing to the many worthwhile projects and charities associated with this great game.
