A PROCLAMATION FOR "NURSING STUDENT WEEK"

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we gain a better understanding of the role played by our student nurses in all phases of community life; and

WHEREAS, the contribution to the health and well-being of our citizens made by the student nurse extends far above and beyond the purview of our hospitals; and

WHEREAS, nursing as a vocation offers many evenues of service as well as useful lifetime training in whatever capacity they may be called upon to serve; and

WHEREAS, there is a pressing need for greater numbers of trained nursing personnel, a need which will continue to grow as medical services expand to meet the requirements of our increasing population and scientific and medical advances;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 8 - 15, 1962
