A PROCLAMATION FOR "THOMAS GARRIGUE MASARYK DAY"

- WHEREAS, Minnesotens should be keenly aware of the great contributions of men fighting for the ideals of democratic principles-champions of liberty; and,
- THEREAS, Thomas Garrigus Massryk represents a life-time effort of procleiming a democratic form of government in one of the darkest hours of the twentieth century in his founding of the original Cescheslovakien Republic later to be destroyed by the communist menance; and,
- WHEREAS, Thomas Corrigue Masaryk fought for the blessings of liberty which ere so dearly loved by all men in this country in observing that a democracy is the endeavor to combat arbitrary will and violence; and,
- VHEREAS, the people of linnesota have been enriched by the example of Thomas Garrigue Dasaryk symbolizing to all that the happiness of manking can only be found in the blessings of liberty;
- MCI, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do herely proclaim the day of September 14, 1962 as

as a seminder to all of the citizens of the State of Minnesota that champions of liberty have fought for the freedoms which us enjoy in this country in catabilishment of the democratic principles of government—a government by thich the individual can pursue his endeavors freely. Matural law distates the conscioueness of all manhind—the common brotheshood of men working together for new achievement, new goals, and new understandings which can only lead to the greater steadfastness of freedom—loving people.
