A PROCLAMATION FOR "CREDIT UNION DAY"

- WHEREAS, the credit union movement is now in its second century of service and credit union members throughout the world will celebrate International Credit Union Day on Thursday, October 18, 1962; and
- WHEREAS, credit unions provide an invaluable means whereby people may pool their savings, and assist themselves to fill their needs for credit at a low cost; and
- WHEREAS, credit unions have proved an effective and versatile tool for combating usury, unfair credit practices, and encouraging thrift; and
- WHEREAS, these credit unions not only promote the economic security of their members, but also strengthen democracy, encourage individual responsibility and the practice of true brotherhood and thus benefit our entire community;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 18, 1962 as

"CREDIT UNION DAY"

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to give appropriate recognition at this time to the many benefits brought to them through credit unions.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty-two, and of the State the one hundred fifth.
