

On the 6th day of May, 1916, Governor Burnquist issued and caused to be filed in the office of the Secretary of State his proclamation, as follows:

WHEREAS, by joint resolution the Legislature of this State has designated the second Sunday in May as Mothers' Day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

SUNDAY, the 14th day of May, 1916,




MOTHERS' DAY,
