A PROCLAMATION OBSERVING THE SIXTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HUNGARIAN REVOLUTION

- WHEREAS, the year 1956 symbolized the unfaltering desize of millions to be free and independent in the overt act of the Hungarian Revolutions and,
- WHEREAS, the Hungarian Revolution demonstrated the ruthless determination of the Soviet Colonialists to prevent the realization of freedomloving people; and,
- WHEREAS, the Hungarian nation continues to fight for independence, freedom, and parliamentary democracy by various methods of resistance; and,
- WHEREAS, these sacrifices demonstrate that the Hungarian people have not given up their hope to join one day with the free world; and,
- UHEREAS, Minnesota is richly blossed by many citizens of Hungarian ancestry who have contributed to the cultural, educational, political, and scientific activities of our State; and,
- WHEREAS, Minnesotans should be keenly aware of the great contributions of these prople of ideals of democratic principless
- MOM, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the day of Ortober 23, 1962 as

"HUNGARIAN FREEDOM FIGHTERS DAY"

as a reminder to all of the citizens of the State of Minnesota that champions of liberty have fought for the freedoms which we enjoy in this country in the establishment of the democratic principles of government-a government by which the individual can pursus his endeavors freely. Natural law dictates the consciousness of all mankind-the common brotherhood of men working together for new achievements, new goals, and new understandings which can only lead to the greater steadfastness of freedom-loving people.
