A PROCLAMATION FOR "LULAC WEEK"

WHEREAS, the League of United Latin American Citizens, better known as LULAC, is celebrating its Thirty-fourth year in 1963; and

WHEREAS, the development of citizens-leadership, the instilling of constructive civic and educational ideals, the training for the formation of true and loyal citizens of the United States, are worthy contributions to the progress and prosperity of our State and the Nation; and

WHEREAS, the continued interest of LULAC has always been to foster better understanding and relations between the Latin American people and citizens of all racial and national origin through education and comprehensive programs of citizenship responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the theme "Thirty-four Years of Progress Through National Expansion" is being promoted during National Lulac Week, in commemoration of the important and significant role LULAC has played in the field of education and citizenship training in our State and Nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period between February 9 - 17, 1963, as

"NATIONAL LULAC WEEK"

in Minnesota and call upon our citizens to join in recognizing the important contribution made by the members of this organization to our American way of life and to the State of Minnesota.
