MIERLAS, the State of Minnesota takes great pride in its 1,411,000 working men and women; and

WHEREAS, through the joint efforts of private business and government, the Living standards of our people have been immeasurably improved and individual pride in their occupation strengthened; and

WHEREAS, in cooperation with the efforts of the Department of Labor, the State of Minnesola has intensively promoted programs in the best interests of the American worker, actively supporting Legislation which served to insure his rights and opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the year 1963 marks the Fiftieth Anniversary of the creation of the United States Department of Labor, to be observed on March 4, 1963, and celebrated regionally in Chicago, Illinois, on March 28;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the month of March, 1963, as

"U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR MONTH"

in Minnesota and urge employers, employees and all citizens of this State to join in this observance in recognition of the Department's many accomplishments which have contributed greatly to the wellbeing of our people.
