WHEREAS, a vital role is played in the nation by the more than two million teachers who are bound by common purpose to provide the best possible education for all citizens, and

WHEREAS, Minnesota's future depends on -- and our people are proud of -- the more than 43,000 teachers in our state, including 33,000 public school elementary and secondary school teachers, 6,164 non-public school elementary and secondary teachers and 4,000 members of instructional and academic staffs on the faculties of the University of Minnesota, the State Colleges and Minnesota's private colleges,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do declare April, 1963 as

TEACHING CAREER MONTH

and urge all our citizens to pay tribute to one of our state's most valuable resources -- the skill, devotion and dedication of its teachers -- by working to provide opportunities that make teaching more effective, to encourage the best teachers to remain in the profession and to encourage teaching as a career for more of our young people.
