

PROCLAMATION

MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS MONTH

- WHEREAS, multiple sclerosis is the most serious disease of young adults, attacking in the 20 to 40 year age groups; and
- WHEREAS, there are more known victims of multiple sclerosis in Minnesota - 6,000 to 7,000 cases, than in any other state in the nation; and
- WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for national research programs that will eventually find a cure for multiple sclerosis; and
- WHEREAS, additional funds are needed to purchase and provide appliances and equipment for multiple sclerosis patients upon recommendation of their own physicians; and
- WHEREAS, funds also are needed to underwrite a grant to Visiting Nurse Services so that trained nurses can go into the homes of multiple sclerosis patients and give them nursing care;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Holmberg, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May, 1963 as

MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS MONTH

and urge all Minnesotans to respond generously to the fund-raising appeal made this month by the Minnesota Chapters of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society.


