

St. Paul, Minn., June 29, 1916.

At a meeting of the candidates for state and congressional offices on the Republican ticket called to order at twelve o'clock noon of this date by the Secretary of State, Julius A. Schmahl was elected chairman and Thomas Frankson was elected secretary.

On motion of Henry Hines the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, further, that E. L. Thornton be and hereby is designated as chairman of said Republican State Central Committee, that Josiah H. Chase be and hereby is designated as the secretary, and that Fred B. Snyder be and hereby is designated as the treasurer.

Resolved, further, that the chairman of said Republican State Central Committee be and hereby is empowered to appoint an executive committee of seven members of which the chairman, secretary and treasurer of the State Central Committee be and are hereby designated three members, leaving four members to be designated by said chairman.

Resolved, further, that the various candidates for representative in congress from each congressional district of the state of Minnesota be and hereby are designated and empowered to appoint a congressional committee from each of said congressional districts and that when so appointed and filed with the secretary of the ~~said committee~~^{state}, be and hereby are ratified by the Republican candidates for state and congressional offices of the state of Minnesota.

Resolved, further, that the executive committee of said Republican State Central Committee be and hereby is empowered to designate such county committees as in their judgment is deemed advisable.

F. B. Kellogg offered a resolution to the effect that the Republican nominees for state and federal offices approve and accept the platform adopted by the National Convention at Chicago as the platform of the Republican party for the State of Minnesota but objection was made by I. B. Mills on the ground that the Chicago platform declared in favor of interstate control of railroads and the resolution was referred to the Republican State Central Committee for final action.

On motion of D. F. Reese the Chairman of the Republican State Central Committee was authorized to enlarge the membership to twenty-one if it was deemed expedient.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
