

Declaration of return of the Special Election held in
the Village of Mount, Minnesota, on the even day of June,
1910, on the question of incorporation.

"I do solemnly declare on this the Village of
Mount, Washington County, Minnesota, 1911, re-incorporated
under the provisions of Chapter 1200 General Statutes of
Minnesota for the year 1910, and now affixing my signature and
designation witness."

To the Judge of the Special Election returned,
held at the village of Mount, between the hours of nine
A.M. and half past one on the even day of June 1910, being
certified and sworn that the total number of persons
present and who received ballots for the purpose of voting
was 38; that the number of persons returning signed
ballots and receiving other ballots was Nine;
that the total number of ballots "No" was Thirty;
that the total number of ballots "Yea" was Eight;
and that the total number of ballots cast was Thirty Eight.

Whereas the Village Council of the Village of Frost, Faribault County, Minnesota, did on the 16 day of June A.D. 1916, pass a resolution calling for a special election for the re-incorporation of said Village of Frost under the provisions of Chapter 1205 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for the year 1915, and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, and

Whereas, said resolution designated and fixed the 29th day of June A.D. 1916, as the day of said election, and hours between nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon for the time of said election submitted to the voters of said Village of Frost and ordered that said election be held at Lerdahl & Weber Automobile Shop Office in said Village of Frost, and

Whereas, pursuant to said resolution notice was caused to be posted and published as required by law setting forth the time and place of said election, and the question to be submitted to the voters at said election was in words, as follows:

"To determine whether or not the village of Frost, Faribault County, Minnesota, will re-incorporate under the provisions of Chapter 1205 General Statutes of Minnesota for the year 1915, and acts amendatory thereof and Supplemental thereto." and

Whereas, pursuant to said resolution and said notices the said Special election was held at the time and place aforesaid, and the question above mentioned was voted upon at said special election, and

Whereas, the officers in charge of said election made and filed with the Village Recorder of the said Village of Frost, their certificate showing the results of said election, and made there return thereon which said certificate

and return show that there were 30 ballots cast in favor of re-incorporation and 8 ballots as against re-incorporation as provided in said resolution and in said notice of election, and as recited on the special election ballot, and

Whereas, from said certificate and return it appears that a majority of the votes cast at said election were in favor of a re-incorporation of the said Village of Frost, Faribault County, Minnesota, as is more specifically set forth in the aforesaid resolution, notice of election and special election ballot,

Now Therefore be it resolved, by the Village Council of the Village of Frost, Faribault County, Minnesota, that a majority of the votes cast at the special election held on June 29th, 1916, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon were in favor of the re-incorporation of the said village of Frost,

Be it further resolved, that the said Village Council does herein and hereby declare that a majority of the votes cast were in the affirmative on the question submitted to the electors of said village,

Be it further resolved that the said village Recorder be and he is hereby authorized and directed to file with the County Auditor of the County of Faribault and State of Minnesota a certified copy of this resolution, and also to file with the Secretary of State a certified copy of this resolution.

Dated and passed this 30 day of June 1916.

qualified, opened the polls by proclamation, and election
proceeded by ballot without adjournment or interruption until
closed.

The question voted on at such election as stated in
the no two lines was:

"Shall the Village of Frost, Marshall County,
Minnesota re-incorporate under the provisions of
Chapter 140B General Statutes of Minnesota for the year
1920, and acts supplementary thereto and supplemental thereto."

At nine o'clock in the afternoon of said day
the polls were closed, proclamation thereof having been made
by one of the judges thirty minutes prior thereto.

Two judges then proceeded to poll the count and certified the votes, and a true statement copy of the tally presented to the voters by the Clerk who recorded the same in the Village of Minot Book.

BELIEVING IN HONESTY OR CRAFTINESS.

According to a true statement of the results of the counting and summing of votes by ballot at the special election of the Village of Minot, Burleigh County, Minnesota, held on the 20th day of June A.D. 1916, no proclamation to the voters by the Clerk of said election

Thirty ballots were cast for re-incorporation.
Eight ballots were cast against re-incorporation.
