WHEREAS, The American Labor movement has, throughout its history, brought about better working conditions and wage standards far superior to those anywhere else in the world through the processes of collective bargaining with fair employers; and

WHEREAS, Organized Labor's distinctive emblems -- the Union Label, the Shop Card, the Store Card and the Service Button -- are symbols of highest quality, fair play between workers and their employers and the American way of life; and

WHEREAS, The American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations and its national Union Label and Service Trades Department, which sponsors and produces UNION LABEL WEEK, have unanimously designated the period September 2 - 8, 1963 as UNION LABEL WEEK;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Polvaz, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 2 - 8, 1963 as

"UNION LABEL WEEK"

In Minnesota and urge all citizens to set aside this time to recognize and pay tribute to these men who have so worthily served their country and its people.
